Why become a sponsor?

As a sponsor you have the ability to make a major impact with your gift and direct it to the program you want to support or to contribute to the overall operating costs of our organization.

How does sponsorship help the organization?

Sponsorship helps our organization:

- have more consistent income throughout the year which helps us to be able to plan ahead in our programs
 - have the ability to augment and grow our program capacity as needs and requests for programs come in faster than grant funding is received
 - helps to supplement the funding of programs when other sources of funding don't fully cover 100% of expenses
- Sponsorship also gives our organization the ability to test new curriculum and determine outcomes on a small scale level, prior to applying for grant funding and scaling up to need and capacity
